The accidentals are valid just for the notes that they indicate.

If possible, the work must be played in a low-light place.
The main idea is that the audience has difficult to see the musicians and at the end of the performance, when the musicians leave the stage, the audience has doubts if the performance ended.
All musicians play with the full score and follow the clues indicated in the score. The idea is omit the presence of a conductor.

Oboe: See note 1 in instructions page. Improvise random notes starting in high-range and gradually extend range to cover the full range of instrument (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Harpsichord: See note 1 in instructions page. Improvise random notes starting in high-range and gradually extend range to cover the full range of instrument (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Percussion: See note 2 in instructions page. Improve randomly using indicated instruments: soft mallets, **pp**.

Gruppo III: Clarinet in B_b: See note 1 in instructions page. Improvise random notes starting in high-range and gradually extend range to cover the full range of instrument (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Piano: f, cresc.

Percussion: See note 2 in instructions page. Improve random notes using the full range of instrument (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Gruppo IV: Flute: **f**, cresc. See note 1 in instructions page. Improvise random notes starting in high-range and gradually reach the low-f register (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Piano: **f**, cresc. See note 1 in instructions page. Improvise random notes starting in high-range and gradually reach the low-f register (be careful to not perform tonal patterns).

Percussion: set of cans, metal stick: **pp**.
